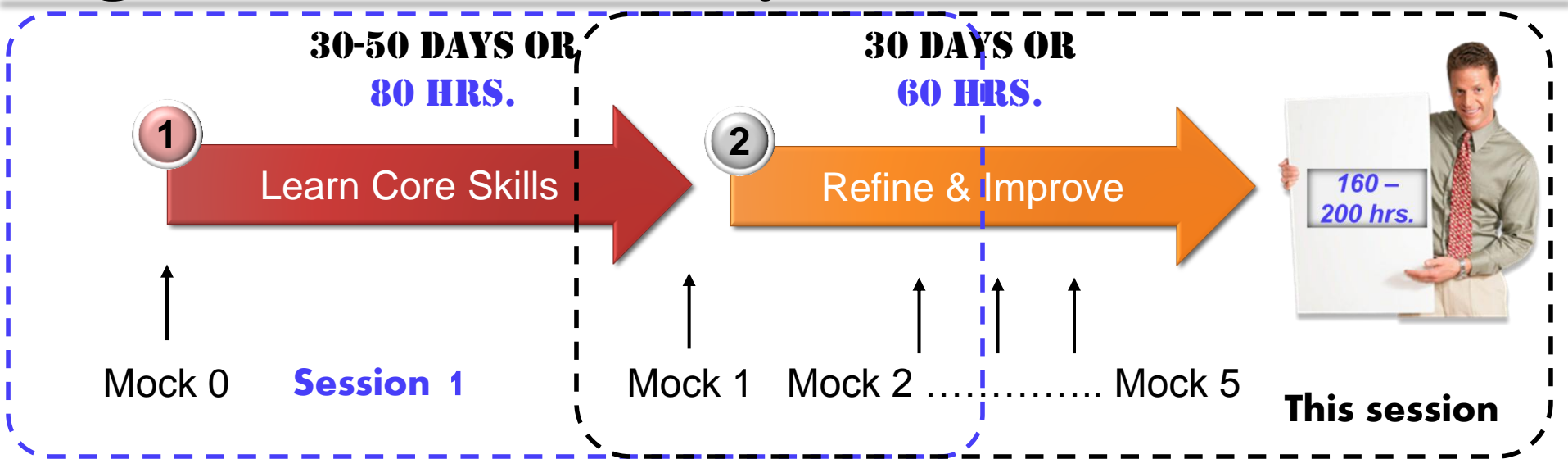

High level 2 Phase Study Plan


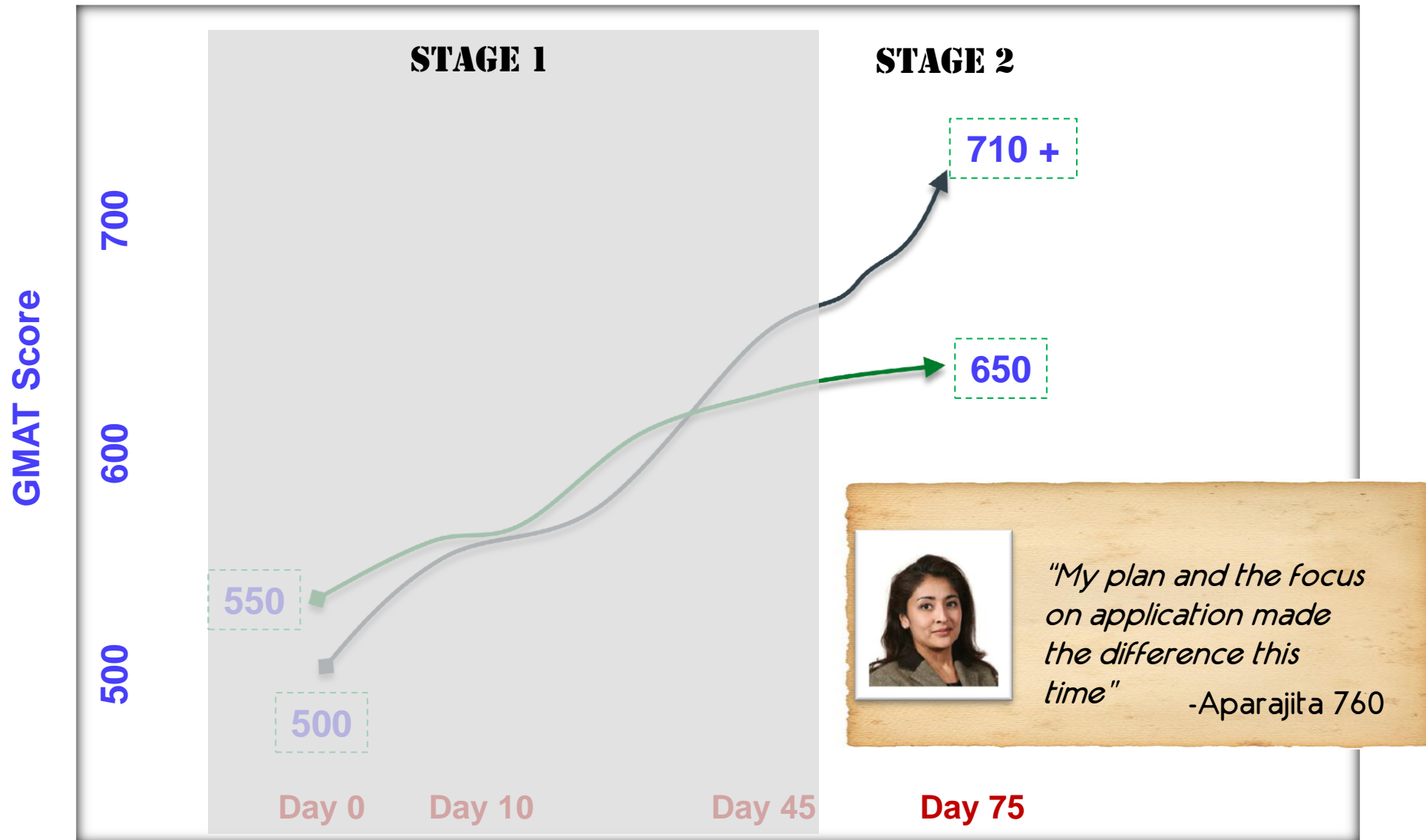

So what is Takt Time

Takt time, derived from the German word **Taktzeit** which translates to *cycle time*, sets the pace for industrial manufacturing lines
=> Time required to answer a question without compromising accuracy.

CR Accuracy Variation

Your accuracy Suffers if you have less time



Why is Takt Time important?

1. Helps budget timing in mocks.
2. Proves that you cannot solve more questions in less time without impacting accuracy

1. Grockit quiz with SC/C/RC question types.

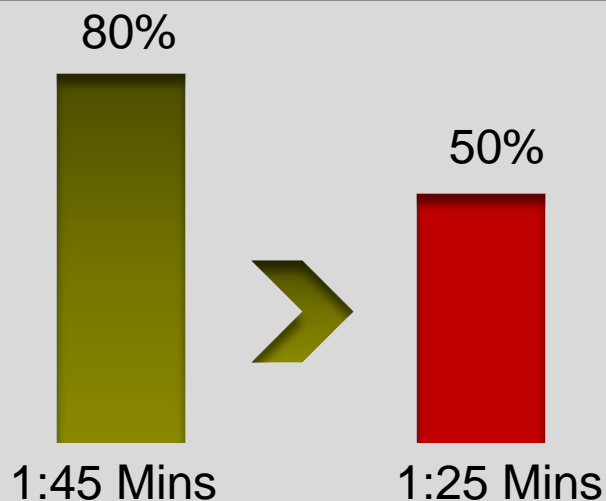

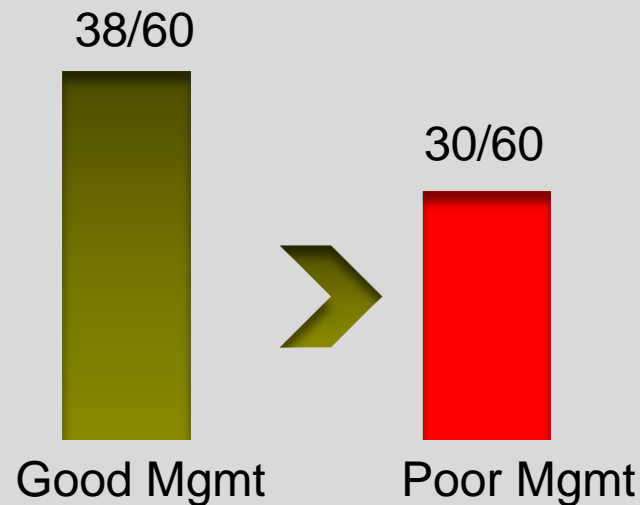
What impact could Takt Time have

Takt time, derived from the German word **Taktzeit** which translates to *cycle time*, sets the pace for industrial manufacturing lines

Your accuracy Suffers if you have less time



Time Management can have up to 10 point impact on your score

How to use this Takt Time?

Attributes of Takt Time

1. It varies from person to person
2. It cannot be changed 2 days before your mock/test
3. It can be changed with persistent effort



"Reduced SC Takt time from 1:30 to 1:10 without impacting accuracy" -Jai 720

How can you use Takt Time?

Strategize Timing in Mocks

Scenario: You have 10 minutes and 8 Questions. Your Takt Time in SC is 1:25, CR is 1:45, RC is 2:00 minutes. How will you proceed further

Strategize Preparation

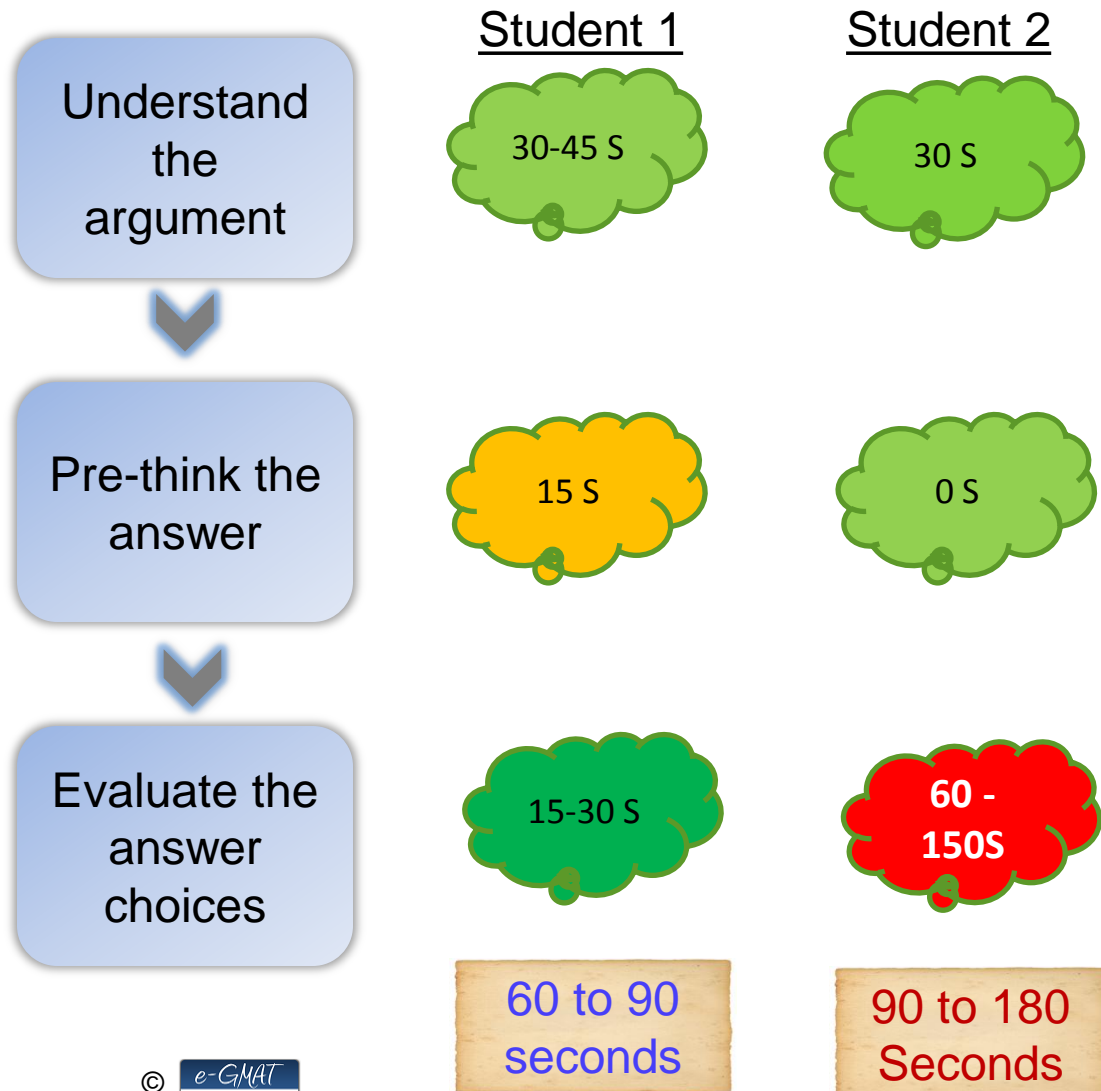
Make conscious effort to improve your Takt Time by

1. Internalizing process.
2. Improving understanding of concepts.
3. Improving Comprehension.

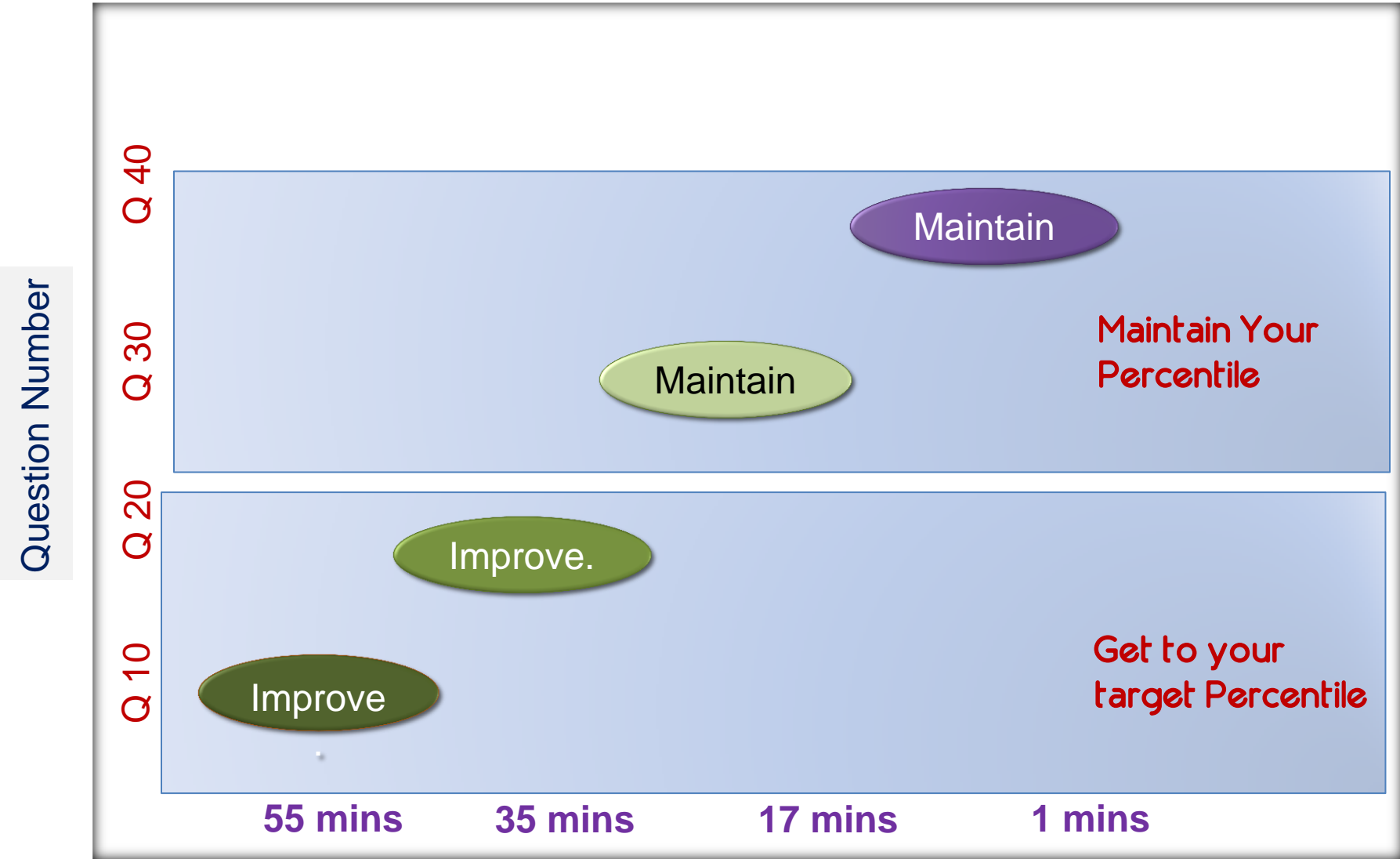
Factors that affect timing

- Ability to read and comprehend
- Understanding of the concepts
- Attack Strategy (Process)
- Familiarity with question types
- Agility of the mind

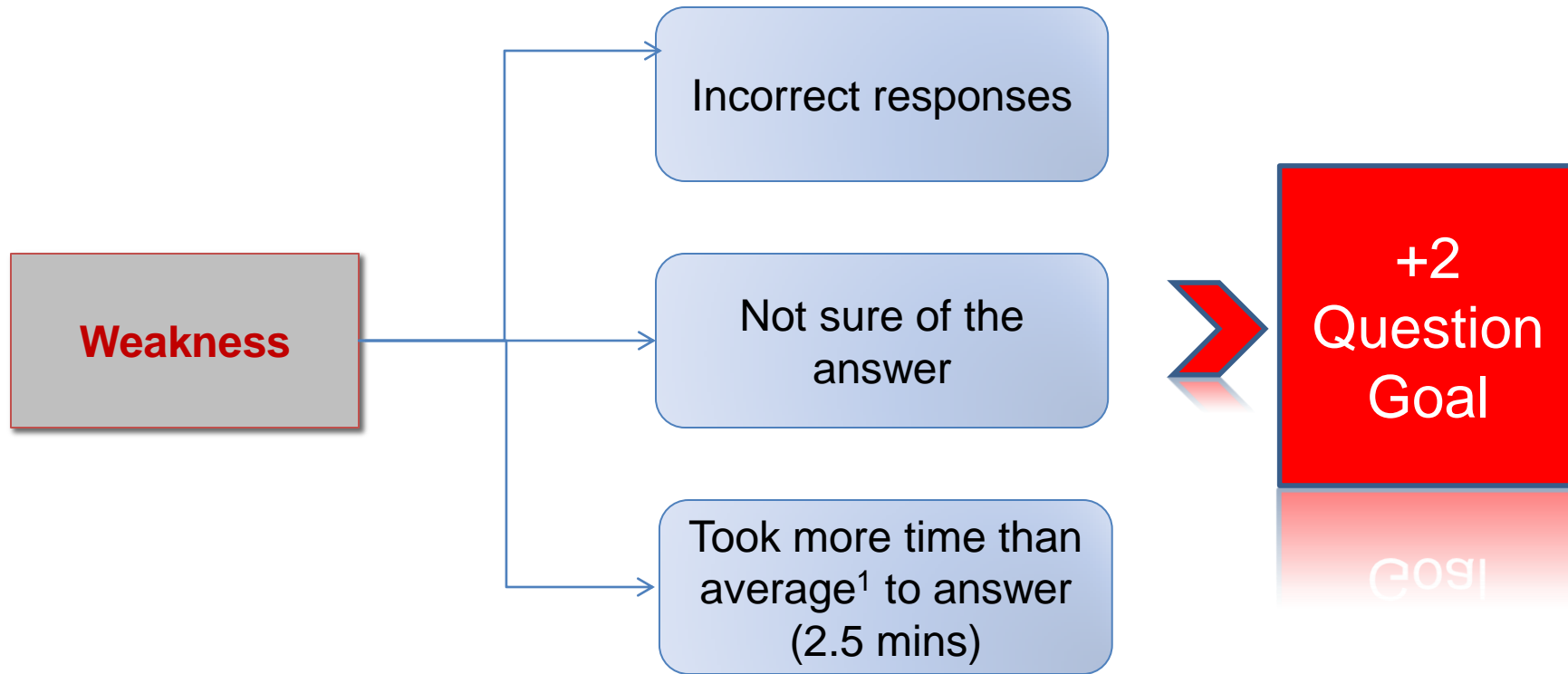

Areas of Weakness



1. Note some questions and question types will take longer (example Bold Face)

These 3 categories will apply to each section

What to monitor in mock test

What to Monitor	How to Monitor?	Why is it important?
Accuracy for a particular question type	%age of questions correct of that question type	Easy win, ensures instant score improvement.
Time to answer question > 30 seconds more than Takt Time	Self explanatory	Implies a weakness, either in strategy or understanding
Wrong answers – answered in less than average time	Self explanatory	Careless mistakes
Your actual time (every 5/10 questions) Vs. Planned time	Check the test timing	Large deviation may have a negative impact on your accuracy
Total Productive Time	Time taken to answer questions correctly	Need to maximize it to maximize score

Total Productive Time – New Term

Total Productive Time => The amount of time spent on answering questions correctly in a mock test.

Use Case: Applicant 1 with Mock score 35

	Right	Wrong
# of questions	23	18
Time spent	41:20	33:40
Avg. Time/question	1:47	1:52

- Clearly, this applicant tried to answer all questions correctly and did not try to improve his total productive time
- As you will see in the spreadsheet; he was 8 minutes behind by the time he reached question #22
- He had a 21 percentile drop from 98 (#21) to 77 (#41)

A few tips

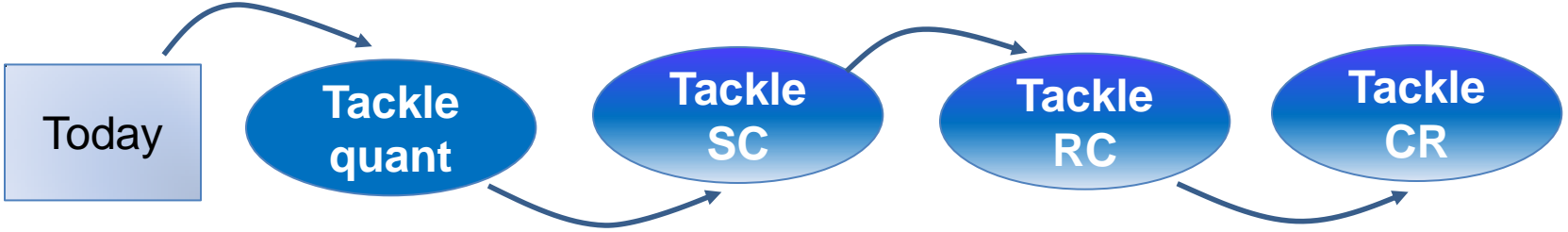
1. Its better to skip 1 question every now and then if you are falling behind.
2. Try to adhere to these timing strategies while appearing for mock.
3. Maximize your total productive time to maximize your mock score.
4. Use your knowledge of relative section accuracies/Takt Time while skipping a question.

4. Make sure that you tackle your weakest areas
5. Knowing your Target Time can help you make judicious decisions in the mock.
6. Aim to improve your Total Productive Time with every mock.

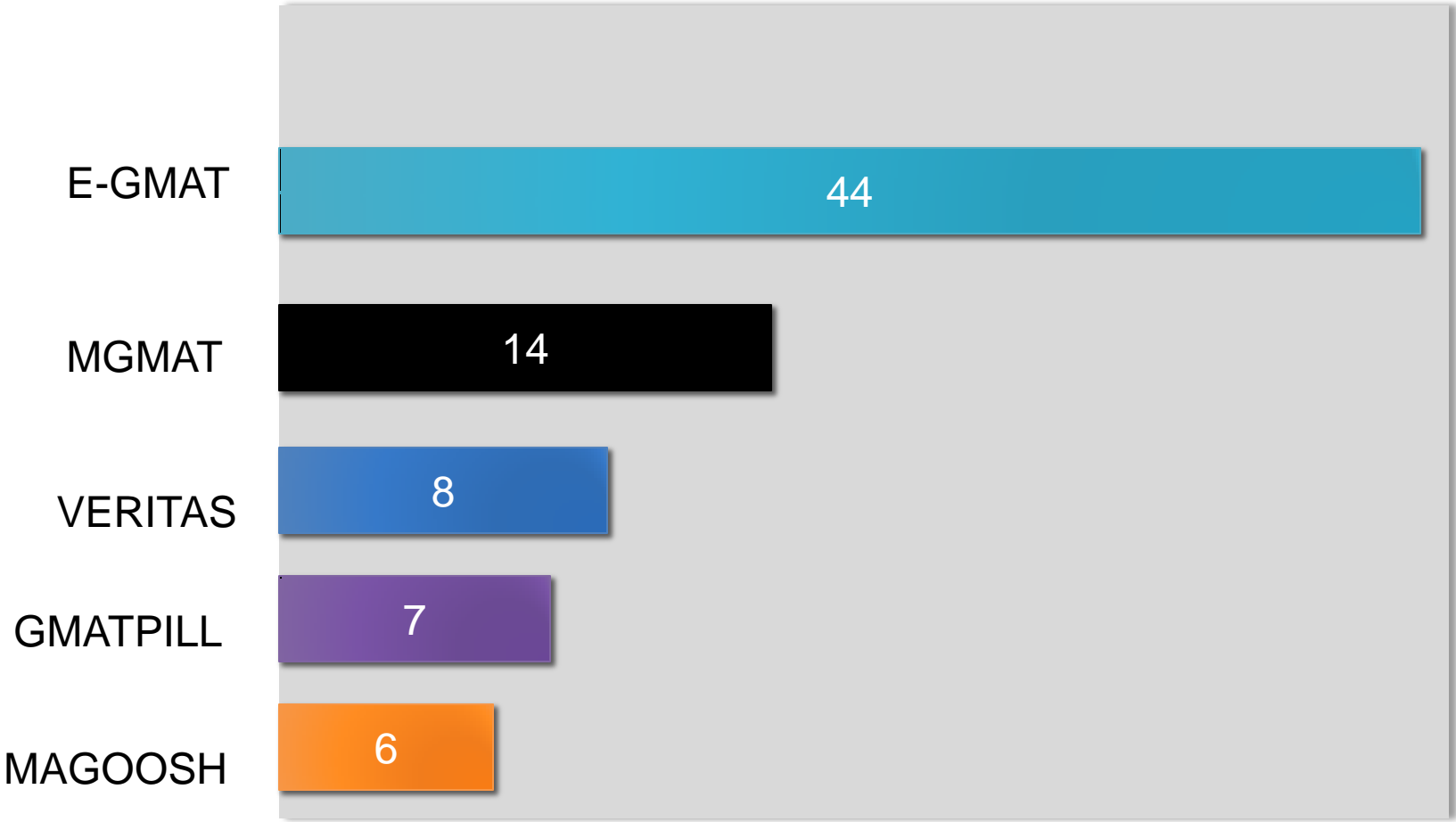
